Today's ride:

A. Start at the Philadelphia Art Museum steps. Bike across the Schuylkill River and along West River Drive.

B. Photograph *sakura* planted on the river bank. More than 2,000 trees are currently planted in the park.

C. Continue to historic Memorial Hall. This building has been the backdrop of many movies and is the new home of Philadelphia's Please Touch Museum.

D. Stop and smell the *sakura* on the way to the Horticulture Center.

E. Fairmount's Horticulture Center features many types of flowers and trees, a pond, creek, and a wetland. The grounds include many gardens and should provide plenty of XPLRing action.

F. Continue to Belmont Plateau and get a great view of Philly.

G. Sunday's sunset is at 7:30 pm. We will ride to the Strawberry Mansion Bridge for some final shots in the warm evening light.
